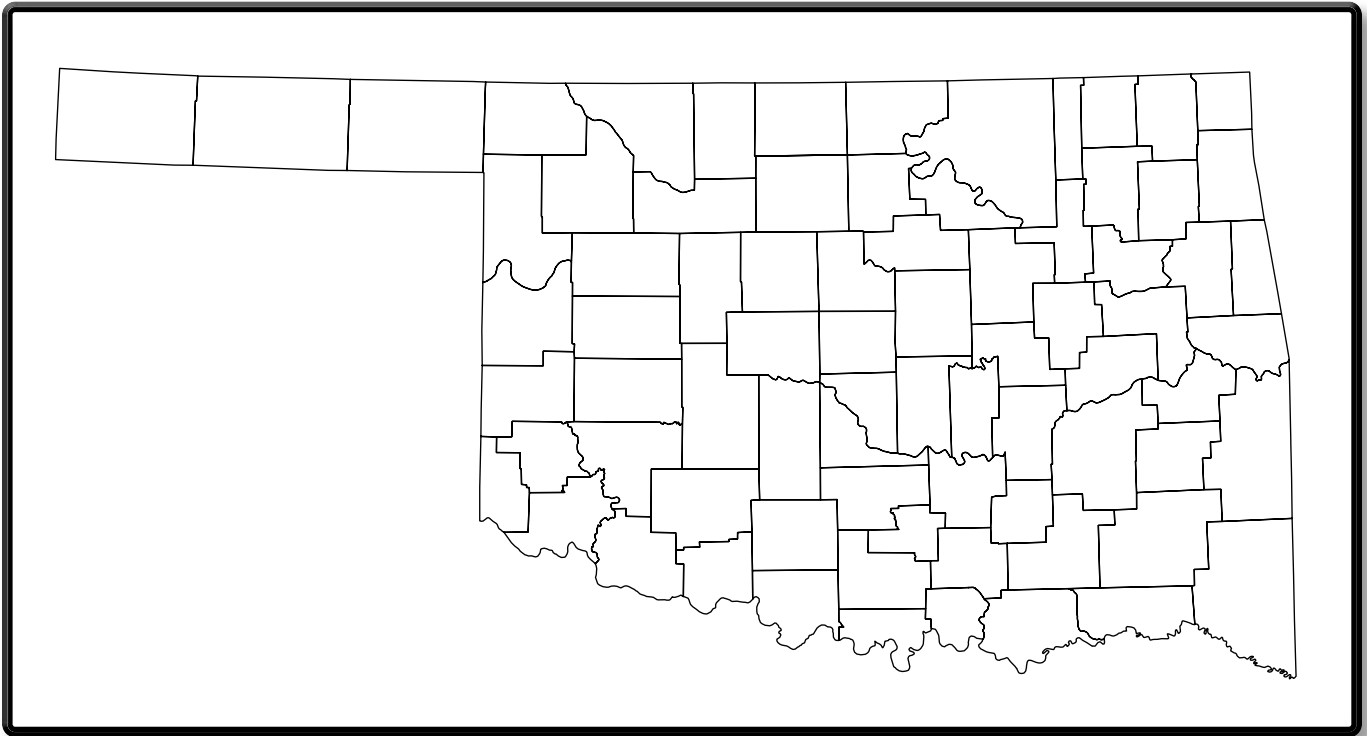

## Internet Activity—An Indian School

Education was important to the Indian nations. The Five Tribes established schools soon after being removed to Indian Territory. The missionaries too established schools in the Territory. In the late 1800s, Richard Henry Pratt became convinced that to “civilize” the Indians it was necessary to take Indian children away from the tribal influences. To that end, he established the first off-reservation school for Indian children—the Carlisle Indian Industrial School in Pennsylvania.

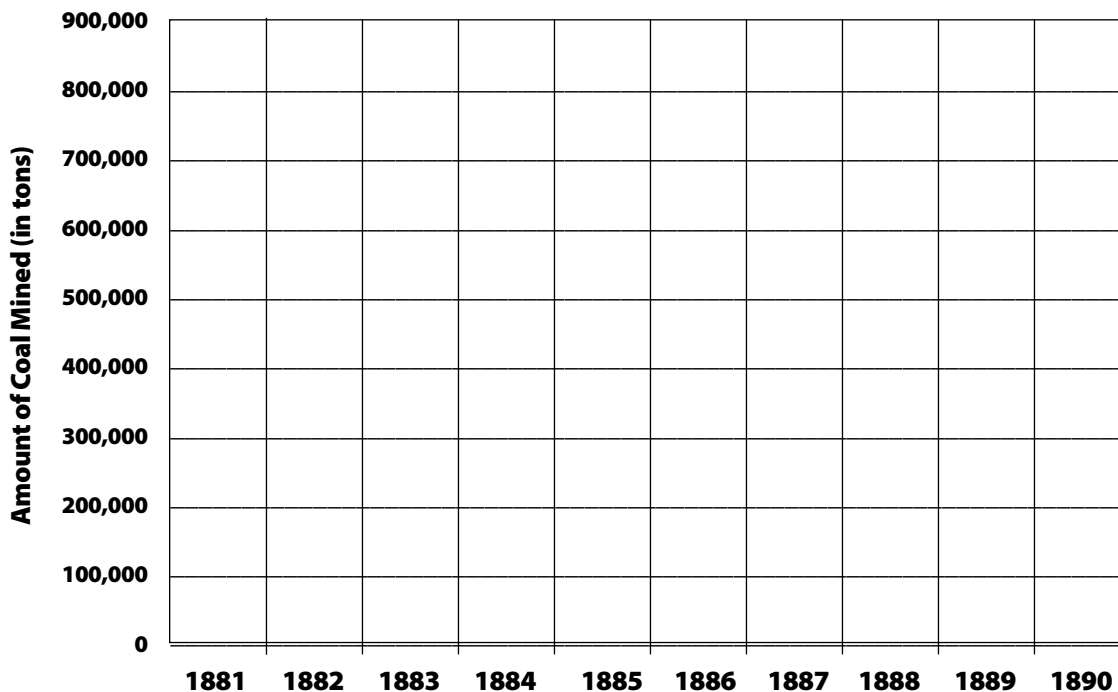
