Part 3: Create Your Presentation

You will use a presentation software tool (such as Microsoft PowerPoint, Google Slides, or OpenOffice Impress) to create your presentation. Your presentation should include the definition of *nationalism*, as well as information on at least 5 people, places, or events and their significance in the movement for independence. Your presentation should be between 6-10 slides in length. *Be sure to use at least 5 images in your presentation*.

Some important facts to remember when creating your presentation:

- 1. Use larger fonts (16 point and higher).
- 2. Use easy-to-read fonts, and avoid cursive and light colors (unless you have a dark background).
- 3. When re-sizing images, drag from the corner so the image isn't stretched vertically or horizontally.
- 4. Avoid using too much text on one slide.
- 5. Use images to help make your presentation more interesting make sure your images match the text and message of the slide.
- 6. Some programs have slide templates that make formatting your presentation easier.
