

6.	Compromise - an agreement worked out by Congress in 1820 that allowed Missouri to enter the Union as a slave state and Maine as a free state; a line drawn westward from Missouri's southern boundary marked the territory north of which slavery would not be allowed
7.	protective a duty on imports that protects American manufactured goods from competition from cheaper goods made in other countries
9.	Slave Act - a law that required all citizens, North and South, to assist in catching and returning runaway slaves to their owners
10.	the process of dissolving the state's connection to the nation and becoming a separate nation
