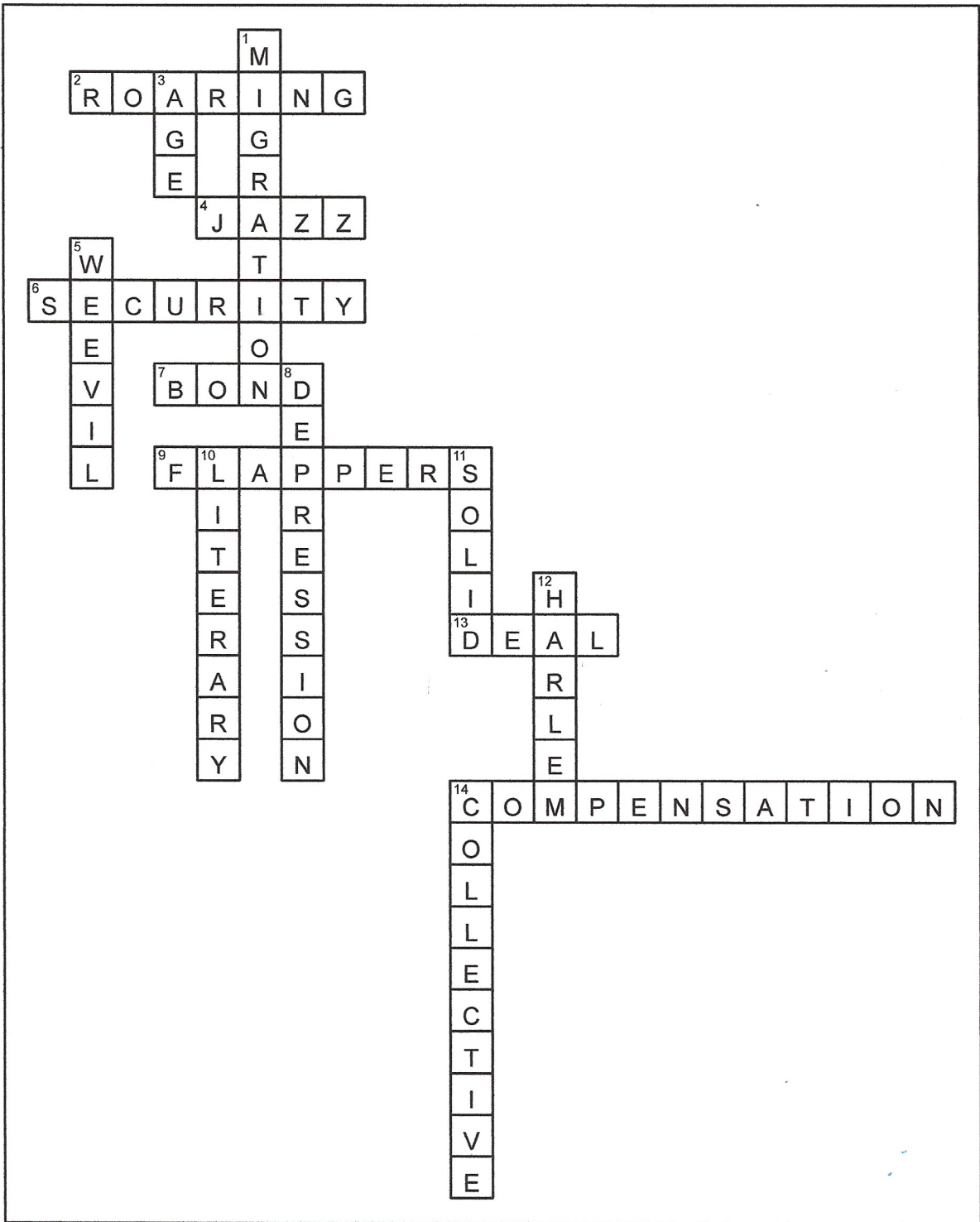

2. \_\_\_\_\_ Twenties - another name for the 1920s; also known as the Jazz Age, titles that imply a pursuit of excitement and pleasure
4. a type of music that had its roots in African American music—the blues, ragtime, brass band marches, and improvisation
6. Social \_\_\_\_\_ Act - New Deal legislation passed in 1935 to provide retirement benefits to covered workers and financial aid to children, the blind, widows with small children, and the elderly
7. \_\_\_\_\_ issue - an opportunity for citizens and banks to lend money to a government for specific improvements or public works
9. young women who broke traditions of dress and behavior in the 1920s
13. New \_\_\_\_\_ - the name given to the programs enacted by Congress at the urging of President Franklin D. Roosevelt; the programs were intended to bring about economic recovery, relieve unemployment, reform banking and credit, and improve society
14. workers' \_\_\_\_\_ law - a law that provided payments for workers injured on the job
