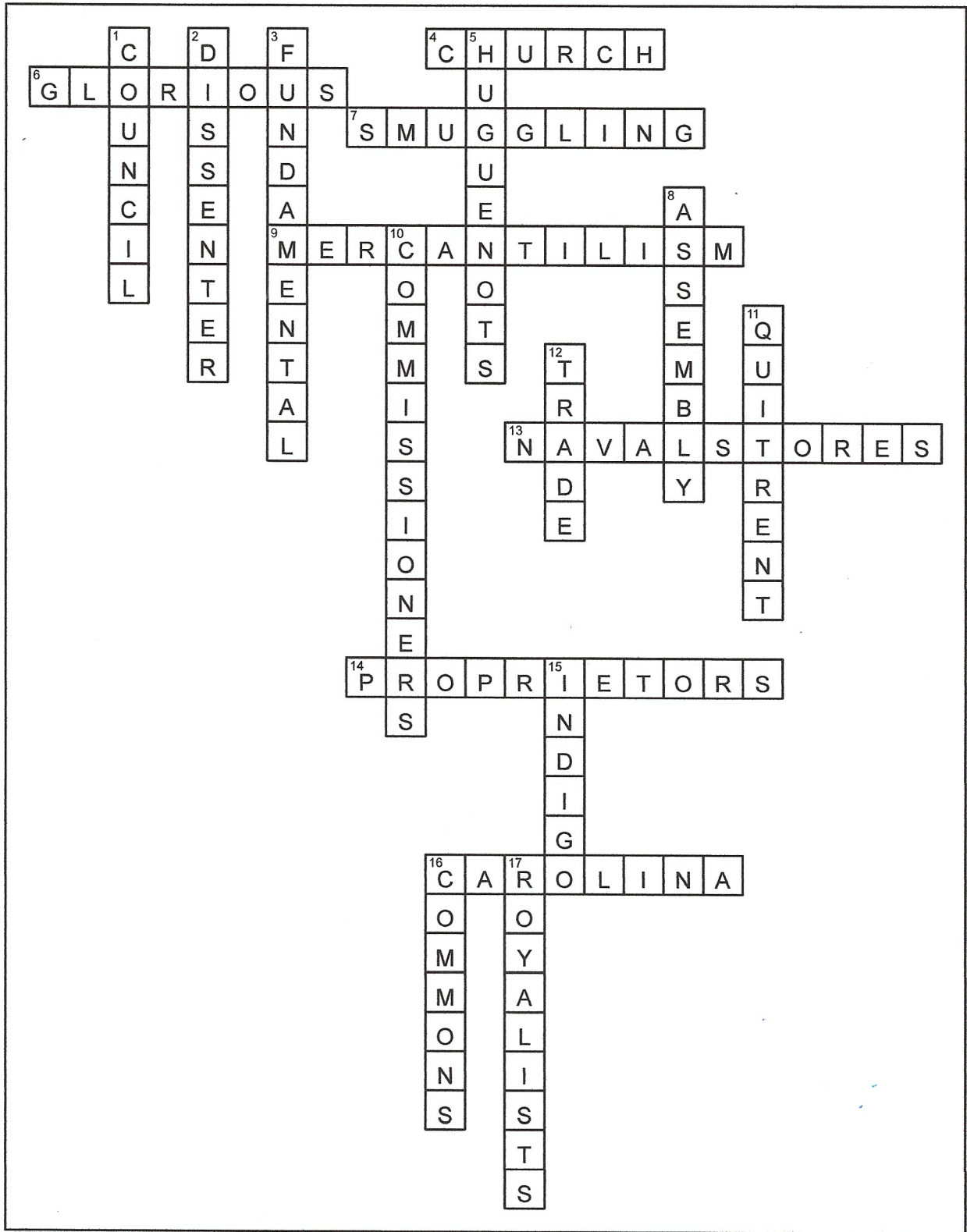

- _____ Act of 1706 - dissenters were allowed to vote, hold government office and practice their religion freely, but the Anglican Church was to be the established church of the colony
- _____ Revolution - the overthrow of King James II of England giving Parliament more power
- illegal trade with other countries
- the economic policy in the 1600s and 1700s that colonies existed to contribute to the wealth and power of the mother nation by providing food products and raw materials
- rosin, tar, pitch, and turpentine made from pine trees and used to make ships watertight
- Lords _____ - eight supporters to whom King Charles II of England gave a grant to establish a colony that included land that later became South Carolina
- _____ Gold - the rice named for its gilded color when still in the husk

- a group of persons to advise the governor, make laws, and act as a court
- a person who disagreed with the official church
- _____ Constitutions of Carolina - the law of South Carolina between 1669 and 1691, determined by the Proprietors, which placed the Proprietors, all living in England, at the top rank of leadership.
- several hundred French Protestants who escaped the persecution of King Louis XIV and settled in South Carolina
- General _____ - the Council appointed by the Proprietors and the Commons House of Assembly elected by property holders which together had authority to make the colony's laws
- Board of Indian _____ - created by the Assembly in 1707 to establish some order in the trade between colonists and Indians and force traders to treat Indians fairly
- an annual rent or tax paid by the settlers to the Lords Proprietors for land granted by them
- Lords of _____ - established by King Charles in 1670 to manage the colonies and make them profitable to England; part of the policy of mercantilism
- a plant used to make blue dye
- _____ House of Assembly - the representatives elected by property holders to give the colonists more representation; allowed by the Proprietors in 1691
- supporters of the monarchy
